Many children love to take stuff apart and discover what's inside. It's the sense of wonder that turns us into life-long learners.

Children should bring something to take apart. Examples would be: an old computer, DVD Player, VCR, or other devices or machines. Electrical cords will be chopped off, and most things will be rendered unworkable. Things that contain oil or other "messy" substances are not good for working with. Parents should use discretion. Hand tool safety will be discussed (no power tools will be used). For the most part children will be taking stuff apart and perhaps trying to put stuff back together. Students are encouraged to bring screw drivers, pliers, flashlights, etc.
